

BiP supports worthy cause

BIP SOLUTIONS teamed up with the Scottish Government to donate a cheque to the Scottish Society for Autism's School at New Struan, Alloa, a charitable boarding school providing support to children with autism.

Almost £12,000 was raised by members of the Scottish procurement community attending the Scottish Government's National Procurement Conference, organised by BiP and held at the SECC, Glasgow in October 2007.

BiP also donated ten laptop computers to the school, enabling older children to study and learn outside of school hours.
